We'll use his material and offer four sessions in Advent (and there will be material provided for personal reflections both for Christmas and Epiphany). Future of our church: from the Minister

Our upcoming union with Humbie Church

Thank you to all who engaged so constructively at Kirk Session and congregational meetings held in June, about our upcoming union. This is an update on where we are at.

Services

From 1st October, we will have one Sunday service every week between both congregations. We have decided to move to one rather than two regular services, as we found at the union of YBS that a real coming together of the two congregations only began when we started getting to know each other through weekly joint services and events. Transport links can be arranged for anyone with worries about travelling to Humbie Church: and anyone happy to provide lifts from any of the villages to Humbie services should please let the Session Clerk team know, so that we can arrange for pairings. We will, for the time being, use all four church buildings, and there will continue to be separate local services for special seasons and events, such as Harvest, Remembrance, Christmas and Easter.

Buildings

The decommissioning of Bolton Church in due course was decided in the meetings of the Kirk Sessions with representatives from Presbytery in 2022, and duly included in the Presbytery Mission Plan. The Kirk Session agreed at its August meeting to get the sale process under way.

The union committee are now recommending the decommissioning of Saltoun Church, and this decision has been confirmed by the Kirk Session at its August meeting. It now needs to be ratified by a congregational meeting, to be held after the Sunday service on 24th September. All members of YBS Church (ie everyone who is formally on the membership roll, either by Profession of Faith or having transferred from a different congregation) and adherents (all who frequently worship with us and aren't full members) will be authorised to vote.

After this vote, the General Trustees will be informed of our decisions, which will set the selling process in motion for both buildings. We are very fortunate in that we have already received expressions of interest from local groups to purchase both Bolton and Saltoun buildings, with a commitment to maintain them for community use, and ensure their continued availability for family services such as weddings and funerals. We can offer some guidance as to what is required to make an offer to buy the buildings, so if there are other interested parties, they should get in touch as soon as possible. The General Trustees are likely to offer a grace period of around six months to local groups to finalise their offers, before the buildings would be placed on the open market if no local solution proves feasible. The whole process is likely to take six to nine months, and we will of course give plenty of notice before the decommissioning and closing services for both buildings.

Let me say again that none of these decisions and recommendations comes lightly or without due consideration: no Minister or elder sets out to close church buildings. However we are, with our reducing membership numbers, attendance at services, and income no longer able to maintain all church buildings. If we continue as we have done, we will only continue to manage further decline, rather than being able to find new areas of growth, as we have done for the past couple of years.

As mentioned above, Bolton and Saltoun Churches will continue to be used until they are decommissioned, and thereafter we will use Yester Church for the majority of Sunday services, with one monthly Sunday service at Humbie Church.

Rather than duplicating what we do between different buildings, as has happened in the past, we will use our buildings in a complementary way: each being used to its strengths. Yester Church, at the heart of the Gifford community, as well as the Session Rooms in East Saltoun, will continue being used for regular activities during the week. If there is sufficient local interest and support, we hope it may be possible to develop the Session Rooms buildings further for the benefit of the community.

We are aiming to promote Humbie Church with the refurbished Stables (thanks to a very generous donation dedicated to this purpose) more as a venue for weddings, concerts and exhibitions. Additionally, we are planning to establish a retreat programme at Humbie Church, open to the wider church and others who are interested, and a programme of events on different topics. All of these aim to promote engagement with the church and with different aspects of faith, and will generate some much-need income.

Administration

The name for our united parish that has been proposed by our Kirk Sessions, and which found great approval in the congregational meetings, is 'Lammermuir Parish Church'.

The Session Clerks have drafted our Basis of Union, which has been approved by the Kirk Sessions on 29th August. Again, this Basis of union will need to be ratified in our congregational meeting on 24th September, where full members and adherents of our congregation (as defined above) will each have a vote. It will then be presented to Presbytery for approval, so that the union can take place on 1st January. This date was chosen mostly for administrative reasons ie accounting, OSCR etc.

All elders of both Kirk Sessions will be entitled to serve on the united Kirk Session. As office bearers, we propose to continue working with a team for the time being: having two Co-Session Clerks, namely John Macfarlane and Alex Campbell, the current respective Session Clerks, supported by Paul Sales and Wendy Fergusson, as at present.

Finlay Marshall and Margo Hodge, treasurer at Humbie, have both indicated that the union would provide a welcome opportunity for them to retire from their office as treasurers. A future finance team is therefore required!

Property matters will continue to be managed by Ian Jameson, Sandy Wilson and Bill Swan, supported by Paul Sales. Other working groups will continue to work on issues as required.

We have already begun to combine our web presence, so at some point, you'll find all the information on just one account rather than two per platform (currently, and for the past few years, Cressida has very kindly been on top of the websites and Instagram, Facebook, Twitter and Youtube accounts for both congregations).

The future

With the discussions on the Mission Plan, it had already been decided that in due course, after their minister would leave, the congregation of Morham and Garvald would become part of the Lammermuir Parish. Their current situation makes it necessary that this union take place significantly earlier than anticipated. Our union committee will now take up conversations with representatives from Morham and Garvald, and we are anticipating that the union with that congregation may take place next spring. Both of the church buildings in Morham and Garvald will be sold, while the Stables there will remain for future use. We will extend our ministry work to the villages, and the elders of the congregation will be invited to join the Lammermuir Parish Kirk Session.

In conclusion

While change is rarely easy, we know it is inevitable, and the plans that have emerged over the past year or so give us many exciting and encouraging opportunities to be a church that serves God and our communities in the best possible way. We have a strong congregation, where everyone has a part to play and where we can find not only the benefits of a shared faith and way of life, but also friendship and support. Already, with our changed way of working, we are connecting with a larger number of people than we have done for years, and we pray that we will all be able to face the changes with confidence, give thanks for what has been, and trust in God as we move forward.

Presbytery News

Since January, we are part of the new Presbytery of Lothian and Borders (encompassing the previous Presbyteries of Lothian, Jedburgh, Melrose and Peebles, and Duns). The current Moderator is the Very Rev Susan Brown, whom some of you know well, and the Presbytery Clerk is the Rev Norman Smith, one of the current Assembly Trustees and formerly of Granton Parish Church.

The new Presbytery is certainly very active, with many working groups operating (Anikó is part of the Mission Committee) and various events - for the wider church - in the planning. There have been a number of online seminars already, eg on youth work and grant applications, with more to come.

As all congregations are aligning with the Mission Plan, a number of unions are coming into place over August and September.

A couple of autumn conferences are currently being planned, and everyone is welcome to attend. These will take place on Friday, 22nd September in Jedburgh, with a focus on the Five Marks of Mission, and on Saturday, 30th September in Longniddry, focussing on Music, Mission and Worship. If you'd like to hear more or register for either or both of these, please speak to the Session Clerks.

Join us at our Friday Club!

From this summer, we have two Friday Club groups: one for pre-school children from age 2, with their parents or carers (and younger siblings welcome), and one for children in primary 1-4 who may be dropped off.

At Friday Club, we explore Bible stories and our big questions through play, crafts, storytelling and songs, in age-appropriate ways.

We're meeting usually fortnightly on Friday afternoons from 2pm to 3pm, with breaks for East Lothian school holidays.

The pre-school group meets in the Session Rooms in East Saltoun on the following Fridays: 1st and 29th Sept, 13th and 27th Oct, 10th and 24th Nov and 8th and 22nd Dec.

The P1-4 group meets in Yester Church in Gifford on these Fridays: 25th Aug, 8th and 22nd Sept, 6th Oct, 3rd and 17th Nov and 1st and 15th Dec.

We suggest a contribution of £3 per session per child, or £5 per session per family. However, this is a suggestion only and all children are very welcome! We really hope to see many of you there, and it would help us if you could let us know in advance of any allergies, and dietary and mobility requirements your children might have.

And if you would like to occasionally help with the Club - preparing a snack, helping with crafts etc please get in touch. This could also be a volunteering opportunity for your older children, for instance in pursuing a Duke of Edinburgh award.

We are looking to source some additional materials and games for the children's groups who meet at Friday Club. Pre-loved items would be very gratefully received.

We are particularly looking for

- interlocking foam mats
- a play parachute
- wooden building bricks and vehicles
- duplo bricks
- giant jenga or similar games.

If you might be able and like to help us in this endeavour, please let us know.

Opportunities to be involved

It's wonderful that we can meet weekly to worship together. In addition to our services, there are many other opportunities to participate in our church life: you could join the choir (meeting every Wednesday at 3pm in Bolton Church), come along to our Coffee Mornings, become one of our readers, join the welcome team or worship team.

You could help with offering after-service coffees or help with the coffee mornings. You could join the Knitting Groups or add your name to the flower rota. We also hope that the Prayer Group and the Bible Study and Discussion Group can start up again. Perhaps you'd like to start something new altogether? If you have ideas or would like to hear more about any of these, please get in touch.

Reflective walks

We've had two refreshing sessions of Forest Church this summer (with one needing to be cancelled due to the weather), and will continue with sessions next spring and summer. However, as many who participated found it a positive experience to enjoy a walk in nature together, we'll schedule a few reflective walks around the parish. These will be announced (depending on weather forecast...) in intimations at services and in our weekly news email.
